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# THINKING ABOUT UNIVERSITY?

Now that you're in Year 11 or 12, you may be thinking about where you're heading after school. For some it will be off to work or further training; for others it will be university.

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## WHY DO I NEED UAC?

The Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) processes applications for admission to undergraduate tertiary courses at participating institutions, mostly in NSW and the ACT. Institutions you can apply to through UAC are listed on pages 04–05.

UAC also:

- calculates the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) for NSW HSC students
- processes applications to access schemes on behalf of institutions (ie Schools Recommendation Schemes, Educational Access Schemes and Equity Scholarships).

This booklet provides suggestions for researching your post-school options, outlines the process of applying to university through UAC, and explains the purpose of the ATAR and how applicants are selected for courses.



# FRED AND LAURA



Fred and Laura are two Year 12 students who are thinking about going to university next year. Fred goes to school in the city and enjoys hanging out with his friends and playing basketball. The end of school seems a long way away but he thinks he might study something to do with sport when he finishes. He also likes the sound of business studies.

Laura goes to school in the country and grew up on her family's farm. She loves it when her friends come to stay and they go horseriding. Although she always thought she would study something related to agriculture, she likes many different subjects at school,

including Visual Arts, so she's also thinking about being an art teacher, which will allow her to be creative and work with her hands.

Fred and Laura have chosen the same subjects for the HSC: Biology, Business Studies, English Advanced, Mathematics Advanced, Modern History and Visual Arts.

Throughout this booklet we'll use Fred and Laura's story to show you how you can navigate your way to tertiary study.

## **UNDERSTANDING THE ATAR**

The ATAR allows us to compare the overall achievement of students who have completed thousands of different combinations of HSC courses. Its only purpose is to help universities select students.



## HSC: THE STARTING POINT

The Higher School Certificate syllabus and exams are set by the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA).

Your HSC marks, as reported in your Record of Achievement, indicate the performance standards you have reached in each of your courses. Your HSC mark for each course is a 50:50 combination of your school-based assessment mark for that course and your HSC examination mark.

There is no quota as to the number of students who can achieve top marks and students are not scaled against each other.

### HSC assessment marks

As you know, your assessment tasks are marked at your school. Because schools mark in different ways, NESA needs to remove the differences so that it can compare the results in a way that is fair for all students. It does this through a process called 'moderation'.

Moderation aligns school-based assessment marks with the raw state-wide exam marks. Since the exam for a course is taken by all students completing that course (and it's marked by the same people in the same way), it can be used as a common standard against which school assessments can be compared. When assessment marks are moderated, students maintain their assessment rank but may be given a different assessment mark. If you are ranked second in your school assessment, you will receive the second highest moderated assessment mark.

Only assessment marks are moderated; you will always keep your own examination mark.

### HSC examination marks

Your exam mark will depend on how well you perform in the exam and is independent of your assessment rank. You keep your own exam mark, regardless of your performance in your assessments.



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In 2019, 55,031 NSW students received an ATAR. They completed around 27,000 different combinations of HSC courses.

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## Your Record of Achievement

Your HSC Record of Achievement, provided by NESA, will show your examination mark, assessment mark, HSC mark and performance band. You won't be given a single, overall score for your combined courses.

Here is an example of how your HSC marks will be listed on your Record of Achievement:

## ATAR: YOUR RANKING IN THE HSC

In contrast to your HSC results, your ATAR is a rank, not a mark or a percentage. It's a number between 0.00 and 99.95 with increments of 0.05. While your HSC marks tell you about your performance in the HSC, your ATAR tells you about your position overall in relation to your peers. Think of it like a running race: your HSC marks are your time (and your time is not compared to anyone else's time), and your ATAR is your place (first, second, third, and so on). Your position in the race depends not only on your time but on the times of the students you are competing with.

ATARs are calculated in each state to reflect a student's rank against other students in their state. An ATAR of 85.00 in NSW or the ACT will, however, be considered equivalent to an ATAR of 85.00 in other states.

In NSW the ATAR is calculated and released by UAC. In the ACT the ATAR is calculated by the ACT Board of Senior Secondary Studies and released by schools.

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Your ATAR is a rank (not a mark) based on your **position** compared to other students in the state.

Your HSC mark for each course is based on your **performance** in your exam and assessments.

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### ATAR eligibility

To be eligible for an ATAR in NSW, you must complete at least 10 units of ATAR courses. These ATAR courses must include at least:

- 8 units from Category A courses
- 2 units of English
- three Board Developed courses of 2 units or greater
- four subjects.

If you're completing an International Baccalaureate (IB), you won't receive an ATAR; instead, when you apply through UAC, a UAC rank will be calculated for you based on your IB score.

The same is true for students undertaking tertiary preparation programs such as the Tertiary Preparation Certificate (TPC) and Open Foundation.

### ATAR courses

In NSW, ATAR courses are courses developed by the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA). They have a formal examination and you receive a graded assessment. These are the only courses that can be included in the ATAR calculation. ATAR courses are classified as either Category A or Category B. Only 2 units of Category B courses can be included in the ATAR calculation.

**Category A courses** have the academic rigour and depth of knowledge to provide a foundation for tertiary studies; for example, Economics, Geography and Visual Arts.

**Category B courses** don't provide an adequate foundation for tertiary studies, but they can contribute to the ATAR when combined with Category A courses. No more than 2 units of Category B courses can be included in the ATAR calculation. Examples of Category B courses are Financial Services, Hospitality, English Studies and Mathematics Standard 1.

**ACT Year 12 students** who want an ATAR must sit the ACT Scaling Test (AST).

### ATAR calculation

The NSW ATAR is based on an aggregate of **scaled marks** in 10 units of ATAR courses comprising:

- the best 2 units of English
- the best 8 units from the remaining units (max. of 2 units of Category B courses).

Your scaled mark in a course will be influenced by your position in the course and the scaled mean for that course. The example below shows a set of HSC and scaled marks corresponding to results at the 90th percentile for each course.

Course	Scaled mean	HSC mark	Scaled mark

Even though the HSC mark for Society and Culture was one of the highest, it will not be included in the ATAR calculation. This is because, apart from English, Society and Culture has the lowest scaled mark of all the courses. (At least 2 units of English must be included, even if they are the lowest scaled marks.)

Scaled marks are not reported to students.

**The ACT ATAR** is calculated from a student's best three major scaled course scores plus 0.6 of the next best scaled course score (major or minor). The scaled course scores are added to form an aggregate score. Students are then ranked based on their aggregate score, which is converted to an ATAR.



## Scaling

Just as individual units of different currencies are not of equal value (£1 is not the same as \$1), marks in different courses can't be compared because the courses are completely different. But just as exchange rates allow us to compare the value of different currencies, the scaling process allows us to compare marks in different courses properly and fairly.

Courses are scaled using the mean scores and distribution of marks, which indicate the ability of the students taking the course, not the perceived difficulty of the course:

- If a course has a high scaled mean it tells us that, on average, the ability of the students in that course is high – in general, they did well in their other courses. Courses such as Mathematics Extension 2 and Physics usually have high scaled means because they're studied by high-achieving students.
- If a course has a low scaled mean it tells us that the ability of the students in that course ranges from high to low. (It **doesn't** mean that you can't get a high ATAR if you study that course.)

The following table illustrates these points using data from selected 2019 HSC courses.

**HSC mean** = average student performance in the course

**Scaled mean** = average position of students taking the course

**Max. ATAR of student taking the course** = highest ATAR calculated using both units of the course

▶ This student's ATAR is very high even though it was calculated using their results in a course with a low scaled mean.

▶ High scaled means for these courses indicate that the students are generally high achievers in all other courses.

▶ A student taking a Category B VET course can still receive a high ATAR.

Remember, the ATAR is about position, and your position in a course is not altered by scaling.

**Extension courses:** For most extension courses the scaled means and standard deviations are determined by the performance of the extension students in the corresponding 2-unit course.

## Your age cohort

Each state has a different participation rate; that is, the number of students completing Year 12 who are eligible to receive an ATAR. To ensure the interstate equivalence of ATARs, an age cohort is used in each state. This means that a student's rank is a measure of their performance against their age group, not just those who completed Year 12 and were eligible for an ATAR.

**English courses**

Your ATAR is calculated using at least 2 scaled units of English. If you have completed more than 2 units of English, your best 2 will be included first; the remaining 1 or 2 units will be included if they are among your next best 8 units.

English Studies is a Category B course and can be included in your ATAR calculation.

**Mathematics courses**

Up to 4 units of calculus-based maths can be included in the ATAR calculation. Mathematics Extension 1 is counted as 1 or 2 units depending on whether it is paired with Mathematics Advanced or Mathematics Extension 2.

If you study Mathematics Advanced (2 units), then Mathematics Extension 1 accounts for 1 unit.

If you study Mathematics Extension 2 (2 units), then Mathematics Extension 1 accounts for 2 units. This is calculated by doubling the mark you receive for the 1-unit course.

If you complete Mathematics Advanced then go on to satisfactorily complete Mathematics Extension 1 and Mathematics Extension 2, your results in Mathematics Advanced will not be included in your ATAR calculation, even if you have excelled in it.

Mathematics Standard 1 is a Category B course and can be included in your ATAR calculation.

**Accumulated courses**

Courses can be accumulated for the ATAR over a period of up to five years. Scaled marks are calculated in the year you complete the course and the scaled mark can be included in your ATAR calculation when you become ATAR eligible.

**Repeated courses**

You will be considered to be repeating an HSC course if you:

- repeat the same course
- study a different course in the same subject area, apart from an extension course.

If you repeat a course, only the marks for your latest satisfactory attempt will be available for inclusion in the calculation of your ATAR, even if they are lower than your earlier attempt.

Your most recent ATAR will be the one used by tertiary institutions for selection purposes; again, even if it is lower than your original ATAR.

**Re-marked HSC papers**

If NESA provides UAC with amended HSC results, your ATAR will automatically be recalculated and UAC will notify you by email. Your ATAR can increase, decrease or stay the same.

**Getting your ATAR**

You can access your ATAR by logging in to UAC's website in mid-December.

To log in, you'll need your Year 12 student number and your UAC PIN.

When you view your ATAR you'll also be able to see:


- a list of the ATAR courses you studied and their category
- the number of units of each ATAR course that contributed to the calculation of your ATAR.

If you receive an ATAR between 0.00 and 30.00, your ATAR will be recorded as '30 or less'. If you haven't met the requirements of the ATAR, your ATAR will be recorded as 'not eligible'.

If you have a query about your ATAR, you can call UAC's ATAR Enquiry Centre, which operates when ATARs are released. The telephone number and opening hours are published on UAC's website and social media in December.

ATARs are only accessible by individual students or their authorised agents. ATARs are also released to institutions for the purpose of making offers to courses but UAC doesn't give ATARs to parents, schools or careers advisers. You decide who you tell about your ATAR.

### Limited ATAR

Some institutions will assess applicants based on a Limited ATAR, along with other selection criteria.

A Limited ATAR is calculated using the scaled marks from at least 1 unit of English plus the best 4 other units of Category A courses, rather than the best 10 units used for the standard ATAR.

To be eligible for a Limited ATAR, you must:

- be **over 20 years of age** on 1 March in the year you complete your HSC studies
- have taken between 5 and 9 units of ATAR courses, including at least 1 unit of English
- have completed all courses in the same academic year. You can't accumulate courses over several years.

### HSC MARKS AND THE ATAR: WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

When Year 12 students receive their results, they often ask, 'Why is my ATAR low compared to my Year 12 marks?'

The answer is that they are very different measures of achievement: HSC marks tell you about your performance in the HSC, whereas your ATAR tells you about your position, or ranking, in the HSC.

It's fair to say that, depending on what you study, marks around 70 in the HSC could lead to an ATAR in the 50s, while marks closer to 80 could lead to an ATAR around 80.00. This is because most students usually achieve marks between 70 and 80 (Band 4) and, when they are ranked, that group really spreads out. If you are getting marks in the 70s, do your best to get closer to 80 – it will make a big difference to your ATAR. The experience of Fred and Laura, set out on page 14, clearly illustrates this point.



# FRED AND LAURA



Fred and Laura studied the same courses for the HSC. When Fred and Laura finished their exams, their HSC marks and their ATARs showed the difference between their performance and their position.

In the table below you can see that Fred got marks of 70 for all his courses, while Laura's marks were all 80. Even though their HSC marks only differed by 10, the difference between their ATARs

is 20.00. Their performance was similar, but their positions were quite different.

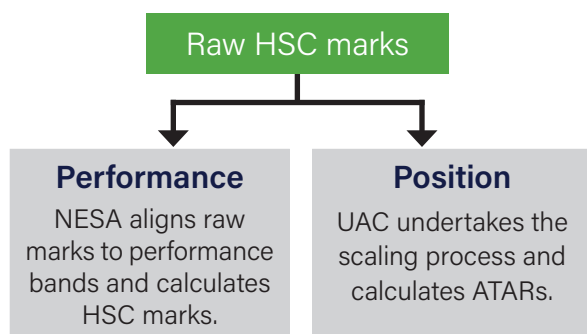
HSC marks between 70 and 79 are Performance Band 4 results. These are 'average' HSC marks, so a large percentage of students are in this category. This means that when students are ranked for their ATAR, those at the bottom of Band 4 (like Fred) are placed significantly lower than those at the top of Band 4 or higher (like Laura).

The 'percentile' column in the table below tells the story of their positions in more detail. For example, let's look at Biology. Laura's mark of 80 positioned her in the 71st percentile, which means she is placed in the top 29 per cent of students. Fred, on the other hand, with his mark of 70, is in the 42nd percentile, so he is only in the top 58 per cent of students. Even though Fred and Laura's performances in Biology differed by 10 marks, their percentile positions differed by 29 (71–42).

In 2019, most HSC courses had a median mark above 75.

HSC marks and ATARs are calculated separately using different methods:



The following table outlines the main differences between these two measures of achievement.

Your HSC marks	Your ATAR
Are presented as marks out of 100.	Is a rank, not a mark or a percentage.
Tell you how well you've performed in each of your courses, according to standards set by NESA.	Tells you where you're positioned overall in relation to other students.
Can only be compared to the marks of students who completed the same HSC courses.	Tells you how you compare with other students who have completed different combinations of HSC courses.
Are provided by NESA.	Is provided by UAC.

Your ATAR is a rank (not a mark) based on your position compared to other students in the state.

### Example 1: Liam and Kellie

Let's consider students who have similar HSC marks in different courses. Liam and Kellie are in the 50th percentile in all of their courses.

Their average HSC marks are similar, 77.6 and 78.2 respectively, but their ATARs are quite different, 54.30 and 80.75 respectively.

The reason for the difference in their ATARs is the difference in the strength of the competition in the courses they have chosen. The average scaled mean for Liam's courses was 43.8, whereas for Kellie's courses it was 62.6. Kellie has done better overall as she has competed against higher-achieving students than Liam. Consequently, her ATAR is higher.

Remember that the scaled mean of a course indicates the overall average academic achievement of the students in that course.

### Example 2: James and Amy

Now let's look at James and Amy's HSC marks, which are shown in the following tables. Their average HSC marks are identical, 76.4, but their ATARs are quite different, 65.00 and 75.00 respectively.

Amy has an ATAR that is almost the same as her average HSC course score (76.4) whereas James's ATAR is much lower than his average HSC course score (76.4). However, the average of the scaled means of the courses taken by James is 43.8, whereas the average scaled mean for the courses taken by Amy is 61.6. This means that Amy has been competing against higher-achieving students than James.

\* The Fred + Laura and James + Amy examples are based on 2019 HSC data. The Liam + Kellie example is taken from the Report on the Scaling of the 2018 NSW Higher School Certificate, which can be downloaded from the UAC website.

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Always choose your courses according to your interests, aptitude and aspirations, not because of how they might be scaled!

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## ESSENTIAL ADVICE FOR YEAR 11 STUDENTS

### Dropping courses

Before you drop an HSC course at the end of Year 11, ask yourself the following questions:

– **Will you still be eligible for an ATAR?**

To be eligible for an ATAR, NSW Year 12 students must satisfactorily complete at least 10 units of ATAR courses. These ATAR courses must include at least:

- ☑ 8 units from Category A courses
- ☑ 3 Board Developed courses of 2 units or greater
- ☑ 2 units of English
- ☑ 4 subjects.

A subject is an area of study (eg mathematics). Within that subject there may be a number of courses (eg Mathematics Standard 1, Mathematics Standard 2, Mathematics Advanced, Mathematics Extension 1, Mathematics Extension 2). If you study, for example, Mathematics Extension 1, Mathematics Extension 2, English Advanced, English Extension 1, English Extension 2 and Biology you will not meet the four subjects requirement because you have only studied three subjects: mathematics, English and biology.

– **Is it a prerequisite for a tertiary course you might want to study?**

Some institutions specify HSC courses you need to have completed in order to be offered a place in certain tertiary courses. If prerequisites exist, they are listed in the course descriptions on UAC's website.

– **Is it assumed knowledge for a tertiary course you might want to study?**

Many institutions assume you have knowledge of specified HSC courses when you begin certain tertiary courses. If you haven't studied these HSC courses you can still be selected for the course but you may have some difficulty coping with your studies. Assumed knowledge is also listed in the course descriptions.

**Don't** think about how they are going to scale: you won't get a higher ATAR simply by studying, or not studying, a particular HSC course. The underlying principle of scaling is that you should be neither advantaged nor disadvantaged by choosing one HSC course over another.

### Accelerating courses

If you accelerate your studies by attempting an HSC course in Year 11, your scaled marks for that course will be calculated in the year you complete it and contribute to your ATAR the following year.

### Your Year 11 results

Your studies this year do matter. Not only are they the foundation for your Year 12 courses, if you apply for admission to university through Schools Recommendation Schemes then the institutions will base part of their assessment on your Year 11 results.

### What you can do now

- If you are thinking of studying a law degree at UNSW Sydney, you can sit the Law Admission Test (LAT) in Year 11 because the results are valid for two years. If you're not happy with your results, you can try again in Year 12. Read more at [lat.acer.edu.au](http://lat.acer.edu.au).
- It's a good idea to get to as many uni open days as you can before you make your final course preference decisions next year. Many are held on the same day or weekend, so take the opportunity to attend some open days while you're in Year 11.

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Around 47% of HSC students do only 10 units in Year 12.  
The next most common pattern is 11 units (around 17%).

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## **STEP 1: PREPARE**

To make the best decisions about what you will do when you leave school, it pays to do your research and find out as much as you can about the areas that interest you.



## GETTING STARTED

If you're not ready to dive into searching for specific uni courses, here are some ideas to help you narrow your focus:

- Consider all the fields of study that complement your personal interests and the subjects you enjoyed at school.
- Research job growth areas and skills shortages in different fields and look at job vacancy and career websites (eg [jobsearch.gov.au](http://jobsearch.gov.au), [joboutlook.gov.au](http://joboutlook.gov.au)).
- Meet with prospective employers and recruiters at expos and information sessions and consider volunteering to gain work experience in a field that interests you.

## WHICH UNIVERSITY, WHICH COURSE?

If you've decided that tertiary study is for you, the next questions are which university or college and which course?

There are many different institutions of varying size and location to choose from and there are more than 2,000 undergraduate courses available through UAC.

UAC handles applications for participating universities and private colleges.

**Universities** offer longstanding, well-rounded opportunities for pursuing your academic goals. Most courses for domestic students are Commonwealth-supported; that is, the Australian Government subsidises your tuition fees.

**Private colleges** often offer more specialist courses that are flexible and can adapt quickly to changes in industry. Courses at most private colleges are full fee-paying – this means your course costs are not subsidised by the Australian Government. However, you may be eligible for FEE-HELP, a government loan scheme that enables you to repay your tuition fees once your income meets a certain amount.

Here are a few tips on researching your options:

- **Start with Course Compass:** visit [uac.edu.au/course-compass](http://uac.edu.au/course-compass) to discover the paths taken by students with an academic background similar to yours.
- **Browse courses:** Courses offered in 2020 are listed at the end of this booklet. Also explore the undergraduate course search on UAC's website. Courses offered in 2021 will be added to the website progressively throughout the year: check back regularly to see what's new.
- **Compare course structures and content:** Although many institutions offer courses with the same name, the way they are taught can be very different. So looking at the areas of study and asking questions about the course content is important.
- **Have a Plan B.** Research all institutions that offer the course you are interested in and the various pathways to that course.
- **Go to uni open days.** Explore the campus and ask questions. Most institutions will have faculty representatives and presentations to explain the content of courses being offered. Refer to pages 04–05 for a list of open days at UAC's participating institutions.



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Uni open days are a great way to find out which uni is for you.

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## HOW YOU'RE SELECTED

To be selected for a place in a course you must:

- meet the entry requirements of the course and the admission criteria of the institution offering the course (check the course descriptions on the UAC website)
- compete against other applicants who meet the entry requirements.

### Selection rank

As a Year 12 student you will be selected on the basis of your selection rank (your ATAR plus any applicable adjustments – read page 35) for most courses.

### Additional selection criteria

Some courses have additional selection criteria. You may need to attend an interview or audition, present a portfolio, provide a personal statement or sit a test. For example, if medicine or optometry interests you, you'll need to sit the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT) in July.

### Prerequisites and assumed knowledge

You may need to have completed certain Year 12 courses (prerequisites) before you can be selected for a particular tertiary course (eg a specific level of English or maths, or a specific science course).

Even if your preferred course has no prerequisites, the institution may assume you have knowledge of a specific HSC course or its equivalent when you begin your lectures. If you don't have the assumed knowledge but do have a suitable ATAR, you can still be selected for the course but you may have some difficulty coping with your studies.

Bridging courses can help you achieve the required level of assumed knowledge. However, these courses are not equivalent to the two-year HSC course and they may add significantly to your workload at university.

Recommended studies are HSC or equivalent courses that the institutions suggest will help you in your chosen tertiary course. If you haven't studied these courses, your chances of selection are not affected but, again, a bridging course might be useful.

Prerequisites, assumed knowledge and recommended studies are listed in the course descriptions on the UAC website.

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There are lots of ways to reach your goal, so think about your Plan B.

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**ACT students** may need to know how their Senior Secondary Certificate courses compare to NSW HSC courses when applying for NSW universities. For a list of comparable ACT and NSW courses, visit UAC's website.

## INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International students applying to medicine, dentistry, occupational therapy and speech and language therapy courses may be required to sit the International Student Admissions Test (ISAT).

Some other courses may also require special categories of applicants to sit the ISAT. The university will notify you if you are required to sit for this test.

## WHAT DOES IT COST?

Your course costs will depend on the institution you attend and the type of course you enrol in. There are two main types of courses for domestic students:

- Commonwealth-supported (CSP)
- domestic fee-paying (DFEE).

Most university courses for Year 12 students are CSP. This means the Australian Government pays some of the course cost and you pay a student contribution.

Each institution sets its own student contribution level for each unit of study. The range varies depending on the area of study.

DFEE courses are generally run by independent or private colleges, institutes or training organisations. DFEE courses typically cost more up-front than CSP courses – you pay the full cost of your course. Your tuition fees are not subsidised by the Australian Government. Each institution sets its own tuition fees for its DFEE courses: the amount you pay depends on the institution and the type of course.

A small number of courses are:

- a combination of CSP and DFEE (eg the bachelor program is CSP, the masters program is DFEE)
- sponsored by the Australian Defence Force (ie the student contribution is paid by the Australian Defence Force)
- exempt from student contributions
- fee-paying with VET Student Loans for eligible students
- fee-paying with no government loan scheme.

The course fee type is identified in each course description on UAC's website.

For the most up-to-date information on the fees that universities can charge and the Australian Government's Higher Education Loan Program (HELP), visit the Study Assist website at [studyassist.gov.au](http://studyassist.gov.au) and contact institutions directly.

### Other costs

Apart from your student contribution, you need to think about other costs involved in going to uni.

For example:

- accommodation: Do you have to move out of home? Many universities offer on-campus accommodation, but you need to organise this early as demand can be high. Renting independently or in a share house with friends is another option. University housing services can help you to find other students in a similar situation.
- travel costs: If you study full-time, you can use public transport at a cheaper rate. International students are eligible for discounted public transport fares on some tickets.
- living expenses
- textbooks and equipment
- computer and internet access.

## HOW TO PAY FOR UNIVERSITY

There are various ways to pay for your uni course and support yourself while studying.

### HECS-HELP

If you enrol in a CSP course, you can choose to pay all or part of your student contribution up-front, or defer payment by taking a HECS-HELP loan, which is repaid later through the tax system when your salary reaches a certain amount.

If you plan to pay your student contributions through the HECS-HELP scheme you must have a tax file number (TFN) when you enrol at university. Visit the Australian Taxation Office website at [ato.gov.au](http://ato.gov.au) for information on applying for a TFN.

### FEE-HELP

This Australian Government loan scheme helps eligible students pay their tuition fees for DFEE courses. (It won't pay for other costs like accommodation or textbooks.) Your FEE-HELP loan is repaid later through the tax system once your salary reaches a certain amount.

### Work

Most tertiary students have a part-time or casual job. Some work in the area of their study to gain some experience before graduating.



## Government assistance

The Australian Government provides financial help to eligible students through payments administered by Services Australia. Visit [servicesaustralia.gov.au/students](https://servicesaustralia.gov.au/students) to find out if you are eligible for a payment.

### Youth Allowance

Youth Allowance is a payment for people aged 16 to 24 who are studying full-time or doing a full-time Australian Apprenticeship.

### Austudy

Austudy is a payment for people aged 25 or over who are studying full-time or doing a full-time Australian Apprenticeship.

### ABSTUDY

ABSTUDY provides financial help for Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who are studying or doing a full-time Australian Apprenticeship.

### Pensioner Education Supplement

The Pensioner Education Supplement is a regular extra payment to help with study costs if students also get certain income support payments from Centrelink.

### Student Start-up Loan

The Student Start-up Loan is a voluntary loan for eligible full-time students who get Youth Allowance, Austudy or ABSTUDY Living Allowance. It is not paid automatically; you need to apply for it. You have to pay the loan back once you start earning a certain amount of income.

### Relocation Scholarship

The Relocation Scholarship is an annual payment to help eligible students receiving Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY Living Allowance who need to live away from their family home while studying.



### Other assistance

If you receive Youth Allowance, Austudy, ABSTUDY, the Pensioner Education Supplement or the ABSTUDY Pensioner Education Supplement, you may also be eligible for:

- an Education Entry Payment to help with the upfront costs of study
- a Fares Allowance to help with the costs of travel if you have to live away from home to study
- other concessions and allowances such as a Health Care Card or Rent Assistance.

### Equity Scholarships available through UAC

Institution Equity Scholarships help financially disadvantaged students with the costs associated with higher education.

They are funded by institutions and awarded to students experiencing financial disadvantage and/or a wide range of other educational disadvantages.

Read about applying for these scholarships via UAC on page 32.

### Other scholarships

Institutions award merit-based scholarships to applicants based on a range of criteria such as:

- school examination results
- academic excellence
- Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR)
- course/faculty of study
- personal achievements such as:
  - leadership
  - creativity
  - self-motivation
  - communication skills
  - an outstanding ability in sport.

You need to apply directly to individual institutions for merit-based scholarships. To find out more, search for 'scholarships' on the institution websites.

## INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

If you're not an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen, or permanent resident of Australia, but are studying an Australian Year 12, International Baccalaureate or New Zealand NCEA, you apply through UAC as an international student.

Check the international course search on UAC's website or the list of courses in the *2020-21 UAC Guide*: not all domestic courses are available to international students. You'll receive a copy of the UAC Guide through your school at the end of Term 1 of Year 12.

Courses available to international applicants are known as international fee-paying (IFEE) courses. Each institution sets its own tuition fees for international students, so fees vary between institutions and courses. International students must pay these course fees up-front.



## **STEP 2: APPLY**

Now that you've done your research and decided on the courses you'd like to study, you're ready to apply. Every year, around 50,000 Year 12 students apply for uni through UAC.





## APPLYING THROUGH UAC

You can apply through UAC if you're:

- an Australian citizen
- a New Zealand citizen
- a permanent resident of Australia
- the holder of an Australian permanent resident humanitarian visa.

Applying through UAC means you don't need to apply separately to each institution. You can apply for up to five courses at any of our participating institutions. It also means you can apply for early offer schemes processed through UAC (Schools Recommendation Schemes) and Educational Access Schemes.

Through these schemes, the institutions are able to consider factors in addition to your ATAR, such as your Year 11 results and any educational disadvantages you have experienced. Read more about them on pages 30–32.

UAC processes the applications but the institutions decide who receives an offer of a place. UAC's participating institutions are listed on pages 04–05.

## APPLYING DIRECTLY TO THE UNI

Some of our participating institutions also take direct applications, which you can have in addition to your UAC application. If you complete both a UAC application and a direct application, make sure you don't duplicate your course preferences. If you do, you will be automatically assessed as 'not eligible' for an offer to that course in your UAC application. This ensures you don't receive two offers to the same course. So make the most of both applications and choose different preferences in each.

If you receive an offer through your direct application, you can still receive an offer through your UAC application. Check with the uni as to how and when it will make its direct offers. You can read about UAC offers in 'Step 4: Accept', starting on page 38.

## INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Some international students can apply through UAC. If you're not an Australian or New Zealand citizen or a permanent resident of Australia, you can apply for undergraduate courses through UAC if, in 2020, you're completing:

- an Australian Year 12 qualification
- an International Baccalaureate
- a New Zealand NCEA Level 3.

All other international students need to apply directly to the institution.

International applicants are encouraged to apply by the end of September for courses starting in semester 1, as the processing fee increases after this date. However, applications for semester 1 don't close until early February. You can list up to six courses in your application.

If you're an international student you will receive advice of a 'conditional offer' from UAC approximately 48 hours after you apply. This is for visa purposes only and does not guarantee a place in a course. Read page 43 for more information.

## STUDYING INTERSTATE

If you want to study in another state, apply through the tertiary admissions centre in that state or directly to the institution.

- **Victoria:** Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre, vtac.edu.au.
- **Queensland:** Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre, qtac.edu.au.
- **South Australia and Northern Territory:** South Australian Tertiary Admissions Centre, satac.edu.au.
- **Western Australia:** Tertiary Institutions Service Centre, tisc.edu.au; University of Notre Dame, notredame.edu.au.
- **Tasmania:** University of Tasmania, utas.edu.au.

## HOW TO APPLY

Applications open on the UAC website in early April. By applying before the end of September, you'll avoid the significant increase to processing charges between the end of September and late February the following year, which is the final closing date for semester 1 courses.

If you are also applying for Schools Recommendation Schemes, you'll need to complete both applications by the end of September.

Can't find the course you're after? Courses will be available for selection in the application once institutions confirm the details. Complete your application by selecting a different course, and change your preferences later. All courses will be available by early August.

### Application checklist

Here's what you need to have ready to apply:

- your Year 12 student number (issued by NESA or ACTBSS) and UAC PIN (emailed to you in April)
- a private email address (not a shared or school address)
- your UCAT candidate number, if relevant
- a list of your chosen courses and their course codes (up to five)
- a credit card (Mastercard or Visa) to pay the processing charge. If you're a domestic student, you can also pay by PayPal, BPay or Post Billpay.

## UAC PIN and application number

NSW and ACT students will be issued with a four-digit UAC Personal Identification Number (PIN) in early April. You will need your UAC PIN to apply for uni and to log in to get your ATAR.

A nine-digit UAC application number is generated after you enter your personal details. You will need this number to log back in to your application.

Keep these numbers handy and don't share them with others.

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Keep your UAC PIN  
private – it can be used  
to view your ATAR and  
change your application.

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## Listing qualifications

Your Year 12 qualification will be added to your application automatically when ATARs are released in mid-December. Most Year 12 students will have no further qualifications to add.

The work experience question in the application is a standard question that isn't relevant to Year 12 students. The question is there for applicants with other qualifications, such as work experience equivalent to 12 months or more of full-time employment. As a Year 12 student, it is not necessary to list or supply your employment experience as entry to tertiary study is based on your selection rank (ATAR + adjustment factors) and other selection criteria, where applicable.

## Listing preferences

As an undergraduate applicant you can list up to five different courses at five different institutions. However, you can also apply with just one preference, particularly if you are still undecided about what you want to do. Once you have your ATAR and know if you are eligible for any adjustments to your selection rank, you can change your preferences at no extra cost.

Some courses have early closing dates and need to be listed in your preferences by the closing date at the end of September. Check UAC's website for dates.

### Changing your mind

Preferences can be changed quickly, easily and as many times as you wish at no extra cost. When you get your ATAR in December, you can make more informed choices about the university courses you want to apply for and change your preferences before the main offer rounds for Year 12 applicants.

### Why the order matters

During the selection process, your course preferences are considered one at a time in the order in which you've listed them. If you're not selected for your first preference you'll be considered equally with all other eligible applicants for your second preference and so on. Your chance of being selected for a particular course isn't decreased because you listed it as a lower preference and you won't be selected for a course just because you listed that course as a higher preference.

UAC recommends you list your 'dream preference' at number one, but **always have a back-up plan**: at the bottom of your preference list include one or two 'safe' options to ensure that you get an offer.

The course listing starting on page 51 shows the lowest selection rank required to receive an offer to each 2020 semester 1 course in the main Year 12 offer rounds (December Round 2 and January Round 1). Use it as a guide to your chances of being selected. More detailed information about admission criteria will be published on UAC's website as it becomes available. The selection ranks required to receive offers to 2021 courses won't be known until those offers have been made.

### Pathway courses

If you're concerned that you won't meet the lowest selection rank for a degree course, don't forget that many institutions offer lower-level courses, such as certificates and diplomas, which can act as a pathway into your desired degree. Consider including one or more of these as a preference. Also, tick the box in the UAC application that asks if you would like to receive information on other study options if you do not receive an offer to any of your selected courses.

Most importantly, take responsibility for your application by reading all emails from UAC and following instructions.

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There's only one place to

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### Supplying documents

Year 12 students usually do not have to supply any documents with their UAC application. If you do need to provide supporting documents, you will be prompted to do so in your application. The required documents will also be listed in your Confirmation of Application, which you can download when you complete your application.

If you also apply for Educational Access Schemes, you'll need to provide various supporting documents, so start preparing and collecting these as soon as you can and avoid a last-minute rush. (Read more under 'Educational Access Schemes' on pages 30–31.)

### Additional selection criteria

Year 12 students are selected on the basis of their selection rank (ATAR or equivalent + adjustment factors) for most courses. However, some courses have additional selection criteria. These can include interviews, auditions, portfolios, supporting statements, questionnaires and tests.

Check if any of your courses have additional selection criteria or particular course requirements. These can be found in the course descriptions on UAC's website. For further information, contact the institution directly.

### University Clinical Aptitude Test

If you wish to study medicine (or some health science degree programs), you'll need to sit the UCAT during Year 12. It is held 1–31 July. The test is used specifically to assist with the selection of students into health science degree programs at undergraduate level at certain universities. If you choose course preferences that require you to sit the UCAT, you'll be asked to include your UCAT candidate number on your UAC application. Your UCAT results will be sent directly to the institutions, which match them to your application for admission to the relevant courses. For information, visit [ucat.edu.au](http://ucat.edu.au).



## Special requirements

If you're applying for entry into health/welfare-related and teacher education courses, be aware that there are special requirements relating to:

- criminal record/working with children checks
- clinical placements
- procedures for employment after completing the course.

Details are included in the course descriptions on the UAC website. These requirements and policies are subject to regular review, so check with institutions before you apply for these types of courses.

## Interviews, statements, auditions and portfolios

All interviews and auditions are organised directly between you and the institution. You'll need to make these arrangements in addition to listing the course in your UAC preferences.

If a portfolio or personal statement is required, it will be listed in the course description on UAC's website. It will also be flagged in your application. Follow the institution's instructions for how to submit the portfolio or personal statement.

Each institution has its own policy for determining how additional selection criteria are assessed. Some institutions may allocate a weighting for each component. For example, the ATAR might be worth 50 per cent, a portfolio 25 per cent and an interview 25 per cent. At other institutions, a minimum ATAR may be used to filter applicants, and those above the minimum ATAR assessed and ranked on the additional criteria. Or the portfolio or audition may take precedence over other criteria, including the ATAR. For further information, contact the institution.

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After you apply, it's free to change your course preferences. In 2019, one applicant changed their preferences 68 times!

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# FRED AND LAURA

Fred is interested in sports-based courses, including exercise and sport science, exercise and health science, human movement science, sports coaching and sports psychology.

He's also interested in business courses, including accounting, banking and finance, commerce, economics, management, marketing and sports management.

Because he has a broad range of courses to choose from, Fred has decided to list five courses in his application:

1. Bachelor of Management (Sport Business): This course combines both his areas of interest – business and sport – but he's not sure he will have the ATAR to make the selection rank (the course listing indicates it was 81.15 last year). Fred's preferred institution lists any 2 units of English as assumed knowledge for this course. He has studied this in the HSC.
2. Bachelor of Sport and Exercise Management: This course is in the same area as the course he has as his first preference but the selection rank was slightly lower last year.
- 3–5. Other business courses: These courses can lead him to careers in banking, finance, marketing and management. He is confident that his ATAR will be high enough for him to get an offer to one of these courses.

Laura is certain of the courses she wants to study and chooses four for her application:

1. Bachelor of Agriculture: Having grown up on a farm, Laura is interested in the land and how to care for it for future generations. Her preferred institution lists Agriculture plus Biology and/or Chemistry as recommended studies for this course, and any 2 units of English and any 2 units of mathematics as assumed knowledge. Laura has studied Biology, English Advanced and Mathematics.
2. Bachelor of Agricultural Business Management.
3. Bachelor of Environmental Science.
4. Teaching course: This course will allow her to focus on her interest in art.

With the HSC subjects they've chosen both Fred and Laura would, according to the institutions, have a good background knowledge of key subjects in these degrees and would likely do well if they decided to study them.

## Gap years

If you're intending to take a gap year, UAC recommends that you apply now and defer. Current Year 12s are eligible for early offer schemes and selection rank adjustments (eg recognition of achievement in an HSC course or attendance at a regional school). Any adjustments will improve your selection rank. In addition, depending on the institution, Educational Access Schemes and Equity Scholarships may only be available to current school leavers.

## ELITE ATHLETE AND PERFORMER SCHEMES

To apply as an elite athlete or performer, contact the institution directly in addition to applying through UAC. Check with the institutions about application deadlines and the supporting documents you need to provide.

Note that you cannot apply for Educational Access Schemes on the basis of missing periods of schooling due to sporting or performance commitments.

## EDUCATIONAL ACCESS SCHEMES

Educational Access Schemes (EAS) are for UAC applicants who, due to circumstances beyond their control or choosing, experienced long-term educational disadvantage that seriously affected their educational performance during Years 11 and 12 (or equivalent).

Institutions consider these disadvantages when assessing your application, and may make you an offer to a course even if your ATAR (or equivalent) is below the required selection rank.

### Eligibility

The disadvantage must have seriously affected your educational performance for a period of at least six months.

Disadvantages could include:

- attending three or more different secondary schools in Australia
- moving interstate

- the death of an immediate family member or close friend
- a life-threatening illness
- the divorce or separation of parents
- work requirements to support your family
- excessive responsibility for care of children or family members
- a severe and long-term medical or psychiatric condition or disability.

EAS doesn't cover incidents like breaking your arm just before your exams. In this situation you could submit an illness/misadventure appeal form (available at the exam centre) to NESA via your school principal.

International students can't apply for EAS.

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Use the name on your official ID in your application: they need to match when you enrol.

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## Applying

Your EAS application is separate to your university application.

For EAS, you'll need to supply supporting documentation. For example, if you apply under the disrupted schooling category because you attended three or more different secondary schools during Years 10, 11 and 12, you'll need to submit:

- an applicant statement detailing the schools you attended and the reasons you changed schools during this period
- a record of attendance from each school you attended.

You can apply for all the disadvantages that are applicable to your situation. You'll need to submit separate statements and supporting documents for each disadvantage.

You'll receive an email (at around the time ATARs are released) telling you which institutions will consider your EAS application. This will help you make decisions about your preferences.

## Automatically-generated applications

After you've applied for undergraduate admission through UAC, we will automatically generate an EAS application for you (ie you don't have to submit an application) if:

- you are a 2020 Year 12 student who attended a school listed in the S01C or S01R schools list (available on the UAC website)

or

- the residential address you entered in your UAC undergraduate application is identified by the Australian Bureau of Statistics as being in the lowest 30 per cent of socio-economic disadvantage in Australia.

If we automatically generate an EAS application for you, we'll send you a confirmation email the day after you submit your undergraduate application.

To claim additional disadvantages, you still need to submit an EAS application, but you don't need to include details about the disadvantage in your automatically-generated application.

## Assessment

EAS applications are assessed centrally at UAC but individual institutions have their own policies on how EAS assessments are used to allocate offers.

Institutions use EAS assessments in two ways:

- 1 they set aside a number of places
- 2 they apply adjustments that increase your selection rank.

You won't be notified of any adjustments to your selection rank made by the institution.

## SCHOOLS RECOMMENDATION SCHEMES

Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS) are one way institutions make early offers to current Year 12 students who have applied for undergraduate admission through UAC.

Participating institutions can use a range of criteria when making SRS offers, including your:

- school's rating of your abilities in areas of study
- school's rating of your aptitudes

- Year 11 studies
- Educational Access Schemes (EAS) application (if applicable).

Each institution has its own policies on determining SRS eligibility and making offers.

## Eligibility

SRS are open to current Year 12 applicants who are attempting:

- an Australian Year 12 qualification, or
- an International Baccalaureate in Australia

and who are:

- UAC applicants for undergraduate admission in the current admissions year
- Australian or New Zealand citizens
- permanent residents of Australia or holders of Australian permanent resident humanitarian visas.

International students can't apply for SRS.

## Applying

You apply for SRS online through UAC's website **after** you have completed your UAC application for tertiary study. Your school will then provide a professional assessment of your ability in, or suitability for, different areas of study and rate your aptitude for tertiary study.

## Assessment and offers

After your school has completed its assessment, your application will be processed by UAC and then considered by participating institutions.

In most cases, institutions make offers to successful applicants before ATARs are released.

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In 2019, almost 16,900  
Year 12 students applied  
for SRS and unis made  
over 19,000 offers.

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## EQUITY SCHOLARSHIPS

Institution Equity Scholarships are primarily awarded to students from low socio-economic backgrounds, particularly those who receive Centrelink income payments.

### Eligibility

If your family is receiving a Centrelink or other Australian Government means-tested income support payment, such as a Disability Support Pension, Parenting Payment (single) or Carer Payment, you are considered to be financially disadvantaged.

You may also be considered for an Equity Scholarship if you meet one or more of the following criteria:

- have carer responsibilities
- have English language difficulty
- have financial hardship
- have a long-term medical condition/disability or ongoing effects of abuse
- reside in a regional or remote area
- have sole parent responsibilities.

If you are Indigenous or have refugee status, these attributes will also be considered.

Be aware that meeting the scholarship eligibility criteria doesn't guarantee that you will be awarded a scholarship. There are a limited number of Equity Scholarships and there are more applicants than scholarships. Individual institutions make offers as a result of a competitive process. If you're unsuccessful it doesn't mean that you're not in need; rather, it means that there are other applicants who've been assessed as being in greater need.

### Applying

Submit an Equity Scholarships application through UAC's website.

By submitting just one Equity Scholarships application through UAC, you will be considered for all Equity Scholarships for which you are eligible. You'll need to supply supporting documentation with your application. For example, if you apply under the long-term medical condition category, you'll need to submit:

- a personal statement written by you outlining the nature of your condition and the personal impact it has had on you
- a medical impact statement completed by a registered health professional treating you for your condition
- an educational impact statement completed by someone at your school such as a teacher, counsellor, principal or another responsible adult who can comment on the impact of your disadvantage on your studies.

### Offers

Institutions make their Equity Scholarships offers after assessing applications submitted as part of a competitive application process. The Equity Scholarships application gathers sufficient information from applicants to determine which applicants best meet the eligibility criteria.

An institution can only award you an Equity Scholarship if you've received an offer of admission to that institution.

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Scholarships range from one-off book bursaries of \$500 to \$25,000 per year for tuition and accommodation.

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## **STEP 3: MANAGE**

Once you've applied for uni, it's important to know how to manage your application. This means understanding your selection rank and how to change your preferences.



## ADDING YOUR ATAR

UAC will automatically add your HSC results and ATAR to your application when these results are released in December. Most applicants will receive their offers in December and January.

## CHANGING YOUR PREFERENCES

You can add, delete and change the order of your preferences online as often as you like by logging in to your application on UAC's website. There is no charge to do this but you will need your UAC application number and four-digit UAC PIN to log in. You won't be able to choose a course as a preference if the course closing date has passed.

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Apart from a few days before each offer round, you can change your course preferences at any time.

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Once you've received your HSC results and your ATAR and have an idea of the selection rank adjustments you may be eligible for, it's time to go back to your preferences to make sure they're realistic. Perhaps you've done better than you expected and want to change the courses you applied for, or maybe you've rethought what you really want to study.

Go back and look at last year's lowest selection ranks for your preferred courses. If you're concerned that you're not going to meet the selection ranks for these courses, consider adding one or two pathway courses to your list of preferences.

Pathway courses generally include non-degree courses such as foundation studies, preparatory courses and certificates, diploma or associate degree courses. If you successfully complete a pathway course, an institution may guarantee you entry into a particular degree course. Otherwise, you can use your pathway course studies to apply and compete for admission to other degree courses. You may also be awarded credit for some of your pathway course studies.

Also check that you're not wasting preferences by listing courses that have already closed or have additional selection criteria or prerequisites that you haven't met.

Make sure you do this by the final closing date for change of preferences for the next offer round. For December Round 2, this is just a couple of days after you receive your ATAR. Change of preference dates for all offer rounds can be found on UAC's website.

## SELECTION RANKS

Your selection rank determines whether you are eligible for selection to each of your course preferences. As a Year 12 student, your selection rank is usually your ATAR. However, if other factors are taken into consideration, these will be combined with your ATAR to adjust your selection rank and make it higher than your ATAR.



The course listing starting on page 51 shows the lowest selection rank required to receive an offer to each 2020 semester 1 course in the main Year 12 offer rounds (December Round 2 and January Round 1).

The interaction of three factors determines the lowest selection rank for each course:

- 1 the number of places available in the course
- 2 the number of applicants for the course
- 3 the quality of those applicants.

These three factors mean that the lowest selection ranks can change from year to year and are not known before applicants are selected for a particular course in a particular year.

The lowest selection rank does not represent the average ability of the students accepted for the course and does not reflect the difficulty or quality of the course.

### Selection rank adjustments

Many applicants receive an offer to a course even though they have an ATAR below the published lowest selection rank. This is because other factors have been taken into consideration in combination with their ATAR and their selection rank for that course has been adjusted and is higher than their ATAR.

### Example

Applicant	Selection rank
1	89.00 (ATAR of 89.00)
2	88.00 (ATAR of 87.00 plus adjustment of 1 point)
3	87.00 (ATAR of 83.00 plus adjustment of 4 points)
4	86.00 (ATAR of 86.00)
5	85.00 (ATAR of 83.00 plus adjustment of 2 points)
6	84.00 (ATAR of 84.00)

In the example above, offers will be made to applicants 1, 2 and 3. Applicant 4 won't receive an offer, even with an ATAR higher than applicant 3, and applicant 3 will receive an offer even though their ATAR is below the lowest selection rank. The lowest selection rank required to receive an offer to Course A will be 87.00.

Selection rank adjustments are due to factors such as performance in HSC subjects, living or attending school in a certain area, and applying for consideration through EAS.

Selection rank adjustments are applied differently from institution to institution and from course to course within the same institution. Visit each institution's website for details.

## FRED AND LAURA

Laura has found out that the institution she's applied to makes adjustments to the selection ranks of applicants who, like her, live or attend school in its catchment area. These adjustments will be automatically added to her application for courses at that institution – she doesn't have to do anything. Laura's selection rank may also be automatically increased by the institution because her attendance at a regional school makes her eligible for Educational Access Scheme consideration.

Fred isn't eligible for these selection rank adjustments as he lives outside the catchment area of the institution he wants to attend and he didn't attend a regional school.



You need to know that:

- adjustments do not change your ATAR; they change your selection rank for a particular preference
- the lowest course selection ranks published in this booklet incorporate these adjustments
- your selection rank = your ATAR + adjustments
- institutions automatically adjust your selection rank if you are eligible.

As selection rank adjustments are course-specific, your selection rank can be different for each of your course preferences.

## INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The lowest ATARs and selection ranks for international applicants applying through UAC may differ from those of domestic applicants. Use the international course search on UAC's website.

Dates for offers and deadlines for changing preferences are also different: visit UAC's website.

## FRED AND LAURA

It's mid-December and Fred and Laura have both received their ATAR. Fred's ATAR is 58.70 and Laura's ATAR is 78.70. Now that they know their ATARs they can realistically review their course choices. They have a couple of days to change their course preferences before offers are made in December Round 2, just before Christmas.



Fred is disappointed with his ATAR and realises he is unlikely to receive an offer to his dream course, a Bachelor of Management (Sport Business), or his second preference, a Bachelor of Sport and Exercise Management, as the lowest selection ranks for these courses last year were much higher than his ATAR. So he's decided to remove them from his list and replace them with other business degrees that previously required lower selection ranks.

He speaks to an admissions officer at the university who advises him to list two pathway courses as well. A pathway course is a lower-level course that requires a lower selection rank. It may help him gain entry into the degree course the following year if he completes it successfully. For example, if Fred completes a diploma course successfully he can apply for entry to the degree course the following year. He may even gain credit for prior learning. Fred puts a Diploma of Business as his second preference.

Laura is pleased with her ATAR and is still keen to study at her local university. Over the holidays she's been doing lots of reading about the environment and has found out that by studying a Bachelor of Environmental Science she will have a wide range of careers available to her, including national parks and protected area management, environmental protection and environmental education and interpretation. She has decided to change her preferences and make this her first preference. Judging by last year's lowest selection rank of 71.55, her ATAR should be high enough for her to receive an offer.





## STEP 4: ACCEPT

Most offers to Year 12 applicants will be made after ATARs are released in December, but there are many offer rounds throughout the year. Understanding how to accept and manage your offers will help you make the most of your application.





## OFFER ROUNDS

UAC advises students of their offers on behalf of the participating institutions. There are a number of offer rounds throughout the year. All the offer round dates are published on UAC's website.

### Main rounds for Year 12 students

Although some Year 12 students receive early offers, the most important offer rounds for Year 12 students are December Round 2 and January Round 1, after ATARs are released. This is when most Year 12 applicants receive their offers.

### Early offers

The offer rounds before this are usually for early offer schemes such as SRS, ADFA (Australian Defence Force Academy) courses, and some non-Year 12 applicants. Not all institutions participate in these early rounds, so if you don't receive an early offer and aren't in one of the categories listed, there's no need to worry.

### Late offers

Offer rounds after January Round 1 are for entry to courses that still have vacancies or for new courses that begin later in the year.

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Accept any offer you receive: there's no guarantee you'll get another one. If you do receive a second offer, you can decide which one is best for you.

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## RECEIVING YOUR OFFER

We'll send you your offer in an email, so it's important that we have your correct email address. This can be updated any time via your application.

You can also view your offer on the UAC website: log in using your UAC application number and UAC PIN.

The institutions (not UAC) decide who receives offers. So, if you have questions, you'll need to speak to the admissions office at the institution. You can ask why you didn't receive an offer and what other study options are available to you.

Some institutions may make you an offer to a lower-level course if you're not eligible or competitive enough for the course to which you've applied.

This means that you may receive an offer to a lower-level course in the same area at the same institution rather than the course you listed in your preferences, even if you didn't apply for it. For example, you may get an offer to a Diploma in Marketing if you applied for, but weren't competitive enough for, the B Marketing at the same institution.

If you successfully complete a course such as a diploma, an institution may guarantee you entry into some degree courses. You may also be awarded credit for some of your studies.

## ACCEPTING YOUR OFFER

If you receive an offer in one round, don't assume that you'll receive another offer in a later round. You must accept your offer by the date indicated in your offer material, otherwise your offer may lapse and go to another applicant in the next round.

Accepting an offer doesn't stop you from being considered in later offer rounds, but you must remove the successful course from your preferences list – or move it to the bottom of the list – to prevent it blocking offers to lower preferences in future rounds.

If you receive an offer in one round and accept it, then receive an offer in a later round, you can choose either to:

- keep your previous offer and not accept your new offer
- accept your new offer and withdraw from the course you've already accepted.

## RECEIVING FURTHER OFFERS

Once you've received an offer, you can't be made an offer to any lower course preferences unless you change your preferences.

So, if you receive an offer to your first preference, you won't be considered for further offers in subsequent rounds unless you move that course down to the bottom of your list or remove it entirely. (Before you do this, don't forget to accept the course you've already been offered!)

If you receive an offer to a lower preference, you will automatically be considered for higher preferences in the next round.

### Example

Let's say you have the following five courses listed as preferences and you receive an offer to your second preference:

Preferences	
1	B Life Science
2	B Animal Science
3	B Science (Physics)
4	B Human Sciences
5	B Natural Science (Animal Science)

First, you should accept your offer to B Animal Science.

If you leave your preferences as they are, then in subsequent rounds you will only be considered for your first preference, B Life Science.

But if you want to be considered for courses other than B Life Science, you can change your preferences in any way you like – even add new courses to your list – just make sure you have a realistic chance of meeting the lowest selection rank and can satisfy any additional course requirements.

Say you change your preferences to the following:

Preferences	
1	B Science (Physics)
2	B Science (Flexible)
3	B Biotechnology
4	B Human Sciences
5	B Teaching/B Science

You'll notice that B Animal Science has been removed from the list. As long as you've accepted your offer to this course, you won't lose your place. If you now receive an offer to a course in your new list, you can decide whether to accept it and withdraw from B Animal Science, or not accept the new offer and keep your place in B Animal Science.

If you reject an early round offer or let it lapse, and then change your mind, you'll need to speak with the institution's admissions office as only the institution can reinstate the offer. Also, if you leave the offered, but rejected, course as your first preference, no further offers can be made because the rejected offer will 'block' any new offers to lower preferences.

# FRED AND LAURA

Laura is thrilled; she's received an offer to her first preference – a Bachelor of Environmental Science. She accepts her offer and starts planning for the year ahead.

Fred is pleased, too; he's received an offer to a Diploma of Business. He's determined to do well and will probably start the bachelor degree in his second year. He's also looking forward to getting involved in sport on campus.



Finalise your choices by the closing date for change of preferences for the next round. These dates are available on UAC's website.

Courses that start later in the year are progressively added to UAC's online course search so check for these when changing your preferences. Not all institutions offer courses that start later in the year.

## DIRECT OFFERS FROM THE UNIS

If you have applied directly to an institution, as well as through UAC, you can receive offers from both UAC and the institution. Then it's up to you to decide which one to accept.

## DEFERRING

After you've received an offer, you may decide that you'd like some time away from study. Some institutions let you defer your course, usually for six months or a year. Many students use this time to travel, follow a personal interest and get some life experience. You are not usually permitted to undertake tertiary study during this period.

Most institutions will ask you to provide a statement to explain why you want to defer and what you'll be doing during this period. There may also be a fee.

If your deferment application is successful, you'll receive written confirmation from your institution with instructions on how to take up your deferred offer. Read the instructions you receive from your institution carefully.

## ENROLMENT

Each institution has its own procedures for enrolment. When you apply, make sure the name on your application matches your official ID (birth certificate, passport, citizenship documents). You'll need your ID when you enrol and there may be problems if the name on your ID doesn't match your offer letter.

### Commit or withdraw

After you enrol you have until the census date at the end of March to pay your fees, sign up for a HECS-HELP or FEE-HELP loan, or withdraw without penalty from the course.

### Get a TFN

If you plan to pay your student contribution through the HECS-HELP scheme you'll need a tax file number (TFN). Apply online through the Australian Taxation Office website.

### Go to orientation days

Many institutions have orientation days for new students. Orientation programs are designed to help you adjust to campus life. Most include subject selection and course planning, so it's important to attend.

## Consider bridging courses

You can enrol in a course even if you haven't completed the HSC subjects that are assumed knowledge for that course. But you may find it difficult to keep up with the course content, or be limited in your elective subject choices.

Most institutions offer bridging courses if you need to do some extra study before the course begins. However, bridging courses are only taught to an introductory level and are not equivalent to the two-year HSC course.

## TRANSFERRING

You may receive an offer to a course that isn't your first preference. Many students enrol in a course with a view to transferring into another course after completing a year's study. A typical example is completing one year of a general degree such as Arts and then transferring to a more specialised degree such as Arts/Law.

Transfers such as this are possible but very competitive and you usually need to achieve excellent results in your first year. Remember that each institution has its own requirements for transfers – check with the relevant institution for more information before you enrol.

In most cases you are not in fact transferring, but withdrawing from one course and applying for entry to another. You usually need to submit a new application through UAC for the new course. Then, if you get an offer you can formally withdraw from your current course. It's important to do this so you don't have additional HECS fees or absent fails.

## OTHER PATHS TO STUDY

Most institutions offer options if you don't meet the entry requirements for their degree courses or need further support and preparation before studying at degree level.

When you apply through UAC, you'll be asked if you'd like to receive information about these types of pathway courses. Choose this option to make the most of your application in case you miss out on an offer.

## Non-degree courses

Institutions often offer non-degree courses, such as certificate or diploma courses. If you successfully complete one of these courses, an institution may guarantee you entry into particular degree courses. Otherwise, you can use your new qualification to apply and compete for admission to degree courses.

Applications for some of these courses, known as tertiary preparation courses, can be made through UAC, or you may receive a 'slipback' offer to one of these courses if you don't receive an offer to any of your preferences; others require you to contact the institution directly.

## TAFE qualification

Another option is to obtain a TAFE diploma and use that qualification in an application for admission to degree courses. Some institutions might even consider a Certificate III or IV qualification. Speak to the uni or college about their admission criteria, as each institution is different.

For information about Vocational Education and Training (VET) providers and training courses, visit [myskills.gov.au](http://myskills.gov.au).

## Entry schemes

Some institutions have entry schemes or programs through which they consider applicants who don't meet the usual minimum admission criteria of the institution. In addition, most institutions have an admission scheme specifically for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. Contact the institution for information about these schemes and programs.

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In 2019, unis made more than 100,000 offers to undergraduate courses through UAC.

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## INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

### Conditional offers

A few days after you've submitted your application, you'll receive advice of a conditional offer via email. The email will list all the courses you've applied for. You can also access your conditional offer advice by logging in to your application. You will need your UAC application number and UAC PIN to log in. If you use an agent, your agent will also be able to view your offer advice.

You only receive one conditional offer. You will not receive another one if you change your preferences.

Your conditional offer is intended for your pre-visa assessment only; it doesn't enable you to enrol at your chosen institution. You must receive an unconditional offer to be eligible to enrol in a course.

### Unconditional offers

To receive an unconditional offer you must:

- have the course in your list of preferences when offers are made
- have a selection rank (ATAR + adjustment factors) equal to or higher than the lowest international course selection rank
- meet any other course entry requirements.

If you don't meet the requirements for a course, you may receive an offer to another course with a lower level of study, such as an international foundation program.

You can receive one offer per institution in each round.

UAC will email advice about unconditional offers to successful applicants between mid-December and February.

### Acceptance and enrolment

Follow the institution's instructions for accepting your offer and paying the required tuition fee deposits and compulsory Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) charge.

Once you've accepted your offer and made your payments, the institution will send you a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE). This document will allow you to obtain your student visa.

If you change your residency status after applying, advise UAC if you are still waiting for an offer. Advise the institution, not UAC, if you've already accepted an offer or enrolled.

For information on application closing dates, change of preference dates and offer dates, visit the UAC website.



## **UAC JARGON**

Definitions of the common terms used by UAC, universities and colleges.



## **ACT Board of Senior Secondary Studies (ACTBSSS)**

The statutory authority responsible for the certification of senior secondary school studies in government and non-government schools in the ACT.

## **Additional selection criteria**

Compulsory requirements, either in addition to, or instead of, normal admission which you must meet to be considered for selection into a course. Examples include a personal statement, questionnaire, portfolio of work, audition, interview or test.

## **Adjustment factors**

Factors that institutions consider in order to increase your selection rank for a particular course (eg achievement in an HSC course related to your preferred degree or eligibility for Educational Access Schemes). Adjustment factors do not change your ATAR.

## **Admission criteria**

The minimum qualifications required for you to be considered for entry to a particular course. Entry to many courses is competitive and the attainment of minimum qualifications does not guarantee you will be offered a place.

## **Advanced diploma**

An award requiring two or three years of full-time, or equivalent part-time, study. This is the highest of the undergraduate diploma awards.

## **Age cohort**

Used by each state in the calculation of the ATAR so that ATARs across Australia can be viewed as equivalent. It ensures that a student's rank is a measure of their performance against their age group, not just those who completed Year 12 and were eligible for an ATAR.

## **Areas of study**

Areas of study or specialisation within a course. They may be studied throughout the course as major areas of study, specialisations or sub-majors, or as additional or supporting subjects.

## **Associate degree**

An award requiring two years of full-time, or equivalent part-time, study which equates to the first two years of a designated three-year degree course.

## **Assumed knowledge**

Some institutions assume you have knowledge of specified NSW HSC courses or equivalent before beginning your course. If you do not have the assumed level of knowledge but have met the admission criteria, you can still be selected for the course, but you may have some difficulty coping with your studies. Bridging courses may be recommended for some students who do not have the assumed level of knowledge.

## **ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank)**

A measure of academic achievement in the HSC that helps institutions rank applicants for selection to tertiary courses. The ATAR is a rank, not a mark out of 100.

## **ATAR courses**

Board Developed courses for which the NSW Education Standards Authority conducts examinations that yield graded assessments. Classified as Category A courses or Category B courses, these are the only courses that can be included in the ATAR calculations.



## **Bachelor degree**

An award requiring three or four years of full-time, or equivalent part-time, study.

## **Bridging courses**

Courses that enable you to achieve the required level of assumed knowledge for a tertiary course. These courses are only taught to an introductory level and are not equivalent to the two-year HSC course.

## **Category A courses**

ATAR courses that have the academic rigour and depth of knowledge to provide an adequate background for tertiary studies and can contribute to the ATAR calculation.

## **Category B courses**

ATAR courses that don't provide an adequate background for tertiary studies, but can contribute to the ATAR when combined with Category A courses. No more than 2 units of Category B courses can be included with the ATAR calculation.

## **Census date**

The date by which all your enrolment requirements must be finalised for a semester. You can withdraw from a course before this date without financial or academic penalty. Course fees are payable from this date.

## **Combined/double/dual degrees**

Allow students to complete two degrees in less time than if the two degrees were studied sequentially.

## **Commonwealth-supported place (CSP)**

A place in a course to which the Australian Government contributes towards the cost, and the student pays a student contribution.

## **Deferment**

The situation when a student has received an offer to enrol in a tertiary course but has been given permission by the institution to delay the start of the course for a fixed period, usually one year.

## **Diploma**

An award usually requiring two or three years of full-time, or equivalent part-time, undergraduate study. These courses are usually characterised by more emphasis on practical skills than on the theoretical content.

## **Domestic applicant/student**

An applicant/student who is an Australian or New Zealand citizen or permanent resident of Australia.

## **Domestic fee-paying (DFEE) students**

A student who is an Australian or New Zealand citizen or permanent resident of Australia who meets the entire cost of their studies through tuition fees.

## **Educational Access Schemes (EAS)**

Entry schemes for university applicants who have experienced long-term educational disadvantage due to circumstances beyond their control or choosing. Apply for EAS through UAC.

## **Equity Scholarships**

Money to help financially disadvantaged students with the costs associated with higher education. Apply for Equity Scholarships through UAC.

## **Extension courses**

HSC courses that enable you to undertake more in-depth study in areas of special interest. These courses build on the content of the 2-unit course.

## **FEE-HELP**

A loan for eligible fee-paying students to pay their tuition fees. For further information, visit the Australian Government's Study Assist website at [studyassist.gov.au](http://studyassist.gov.au).

## **HECS-HELP**

A loan for eligible Commonwealth-supported students to pay their student contributions. For further information, visit the Australian Government's Study Assist website at [studyassist.gov.au](http://studyassist.gov.au).

## **Honours**

An additional year of study at university involving a higher level of study in a certain subject.

## HSC mark

A 50:50 combination of a student's examination mark and school-based assessment mark for each course. It is recorded on the student's HSC Record of Achievement, which is issued to them by the NSW Education Standards Authority.

## HSC subjects and courses

An HSC subject is a general area of study or a key learning area. An HSC course is a branch of study within a subject. A subject may have several courses. For example, within the subject of English, courses include English Standard, English Advanced, English Extension 1, English Extension 2, English as an Additional Language or Dialect, and English Studies.

## Institution

A provider of tertiary study, such as a university or a college. UAC's participating institutions are those for which you apply through UAC.

## International fee-paying students (IFEE)

Students who are not Australian or New Zealand citizens or permanent residents of Australia and meet the entire cost of their studies through tuition fees.

## Lowest selection rank

The lowest selection rank (ATAR or equivalent + adjustment factors such as equity or performance in an HSC subject) required to be offered a place in a course. The course listing in this booklet shows the lowest selection rank required to receive an offer to each 2020 semester 1 course in the main Year 12 offer rounds (December Round 2 and January Round 1). They can be used as a guide for 2021. The lowest selection ranks for courses in a particular year are only known after all offers for that year are made.

## Moderation

The process of adjusting school assessment marks to a common scale so that direct comparisons can be made between assessment marks awarded by different schools. The rank order of students within a school group, and the relative gaps between them, are maintained.

## Non-standard Year 12 applicant

An applicant who is completing a non-standard program of study through, for example, Australian Christian Education, Rudolph Steiner Education, home schooling and the Queensland Senior External Examination. Identified as not completing an Australian Year 12 when applying through UAC.

## NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA)

Sets the core curriculum for Kindergarten to Year 12, sets guidelines for school assessment tasks, and sets, organises and marks the HSC examinations for government and non-government schools in NSW.

## Open days

Open days are set aside for prospective students to visit a campus to view the facilities and meet academic staff and students.

## Pathway courses

Non-degree tertiary courses – such as foundation studies, preparatory courses and certificates, diplomas or associate degrees – offered by institutions to applicants who don't meet the entry requirements for their course or need further support and preparation before studying at degree level. Many institutions offer entry into the degree after successful completion of the corresponding pathway course. Some institutions offer pathway courses through UAC.

## Percentile

An indicator of your position in an HSC course relative to other students. For example, if your percentile in a course is 73, you are in the top 27 per cent of the students in that course.

## Performance band

A band representing a level of achievement in a course. There are six performance bands for 2-unit courses and four for extension courses. For 2-unit courses, Band 6 is the highest and Band 1 is the lowest.

## Preparation courses

Designed for applicants who haven't completed Year 12 or haven't met entry requirements as preparation for further study. Minimum age requirements sometimes apply and the length of these courses differs between institutions.

## **Prerequisites** (see also **Assumed knowledge**)

A specified NSW HSC course or equivalent that you need to have completed, or achieved a specified standard in, before you are eligible to be offered a place in the tertiary course (course prerequisites) or a subject within that course (subject prerequisites).

## **Private college**

Smaller institutions that usually offer practical vocational courses specialising in a particular field such as business, psychology, creative arts or hospitality. They are not operated by governments and fees are usually required up-front, although some courses may be eligible for FEE-HELP.

## **Raw HSC mark**

The average of your raw examination mark and your raw moderated school assessment mark, before it is aligned to performance bands by the NSW Education Standards Authority or scaled by UAC. This mark is not reported to you.

## **Recommended studies**

NSW HSC or equivalent courses that institutions suggest will help you in your chosen university course. However, if you haven't studied these courses your chances of selection are not affected.

## **Scaled mark**

The mark used in the ATAR calculation. It is used because unscaled marks in different courses are not directly comparable, and an adjustment must be made before an overall measure of achievement can be determined. Scaling allows the comparison of students who have studied different courses by determining what the marks would have been if all students had attempted all courses.

## **Scaled mean**

An indicator of the average academic achievement of the course candidature. It is used in the ATAR calculation.

## **Scaling**

The first step in calculating your ATAR. It enables the many different courses taken by students to be compared fairly. Scaling is designed to encourage you to take courses for which you are best suited and which best prepare you for future studies. The underlying principle is that you should be neither advantaged nor disadvantaged by choosing one HSC course over another.

## **Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS)**

Schemes that enable schools to recommend current Year 12 students who have applied for undergraduate admission through UAC, using a range of selection criteria, such as aptitude for tertiary study and Year 11 results. Apply for SRS through UAC.

## **Semester**

A division of the academic year, usually into first and second semesters. Students can start courses at the beginning of the first and, in some cases, second semester. Some institutions call them autumn and spring semesters. Others use session or half-year. Some institutions have trimesters or terms, with an additional study period over summer.

## **Slipback offer**

An offer to a lower level of study than you have applied for. For example, you apply for a bachelor degree and the institution decides that, while you are not eligible and competitive enough for entry, you are eligible for a lower level of study (such as a diploma). The institution makes you an offer to the lower level course.

## **Universities Admissions Centre (UAC)**

The central office that receives and processes applications for admission to most undergraduate courses at its participating institutions as well as applications for Educational Access Schemes, Schools Recommendation Schemes and Equity Scholarships. UAC notifies NSW HSC students of their ATAR (ACT students are notified by their school) and makes offers of admission on behalf of participating institutions. It also processes applications for postgraduate courses. Owned by universities in NSW and the ACT, UAC is a not-for-profit organisation that aims to provide excellence in admissions services and promote equity of access to tertiary education.

## **Year 12 applicant**

A student who is sitting 1 or more units of an Australian Year 12 in Australia or outside Australia (except Queensland Year 12 external students) or sitting the International Baccalaureate in Australia in the current admissions year (April to the following March).





## **COURSE LISTING**
