Message from the Tuckwell Scholarship Program - 1PM, Thursday 19 March 2020

**SUBJECT: COVID-19 – Changes to Tuckwell Scholarship Applications** 

In light of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) situation, and in recognition of the unprecedented challenges facing school students and teaching staff, **the due date for Tuckwell Scholarship applications has been extended by 7 weeks.** Also, the Stage 3 in-person interviews will not take place in Canberra in July 2020.

#### **New Dates for Tuckwell Scholarship Applications**

Candidate Stage 1 Application Due - 3PM AEST Monday 25 May 2020

Teacher & Head of Year References Due – 3PM AEST 1 June 2020

Notification of Stage 1 outcomes – July 2020

Short-listed candidates who progress to Stage 2 will be invited to participate in a video interview in **July 2020**. The principal references will also be due in **July 2020**. The exact Stage 2 dates will be confirmed in due course.

Conditional offers for study at ANU (Degree, Scholarship & Accommodation) will be made by ANU on **10 August 2020**.

Up to 75 short-listed candidates from Stage 2 will receive conditional <u>ANU All-Rounder Scholarship</u> offers on **10 August 2020**.

If it is possible at the time, we will conduct the Stage 3 in-person interviews over the **2020/2021 summer** after which up to 25 of the 75 short-listed candidates will be offered a Tuckwell Scholarship to commence study at ANU in Semester 1, 2021. Flexible arrangements will be made to accommodate the travel constraints for interview candidates on a case-by-case basis.

We will continue to monitor the (COVID-19) situation and may introduce additional changes to this year's Tuckwell Scholarship application process in response to directives from the relevant authorities.

We will advise applicants of any changes that are made to the application process or timelines via email and our website.

- 4. Connection and commitment to Australia.


Before commencing an application, we encourage eligible applicants to:

After you register on the <u>ANU Direct Application</u> system and indicate that you wish to apply for a Tuckwell Scholarship, you will receive an email that provides access to the <u>Stage 1</u> Application Form.

# **Applying direct for 2021**


You can apply direct to ANU for 2021 and be considered for an early conditional offer. This will allow you to focus on what's really important - completing your final year.

Direct applications open 4 March 2020. You can apply if:

- You will complete your Australian Year 12 studies in 2020 or an International Baccalaureate Diploma in November 2020
- You will be applying for an undergraduate program that starts in 2021.

#### What you need to know:

- There is no application fee
- You will be required to meet the <u>co-curricular or service requirement</u>
- You will apply for admission, guaranteed accommodation, and over 200 scholarships all in one application

#### **Applying through UAC for 2021**

If you are not a current school leaver and/or did not study an Australian Year 12 or International Baccalaureate program, you must apply for admission to the university through the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC). UAC applications for Semester 1 2021 will open later in the year, please refer to <a href="the UAC website">the UAC website</a> for more information on the opening and closing dates for each application round.

# What is the co-curricular or service requirement?

As part of your domestic direct application, you need to demonstrate your involvement in activities outside of the classroom, such as sports, volunteering, internships and exchange opportunities.

This is a compulsory requirement of your application.

## How it works

We consider activities you have participated in from Year 10 through to Year 12 (prior to applications closing).

Important things to note:

- You can choose a maximum of five activities that you are most proud for your application.
- This co-curricular or service requirement is a threshold which is either met or not met.
- We won't rank you against other applicants based on the activities you complete.
- The co-curricular or service requirement won't modify your ATAR or academic rank.
- You must meet the co-curricular or service requirement and all other admission requirements for your preferred program.

Once you have decided on the activities you want to include, you need to provide supporting documentation as part of your application.

The documentation needs to:

- identify you (the applicant, by full name) as having participated in the co-curricular or service activity
- identify the activity (by name) you were involved in
- identify the dates you were engaged in the activity

If you already have existing documentation for your activity, you might already be set. Please see the <u>examples of acceptable documents</u>.

You can also use the <u>co-curricular or service activity declaration</u> and have the form signed by someone who managed your activity.

#### What activities count?

We have mapped activities into seven key areas:

- 1. Community engagement
- 2. Inclusion and awareness of diversity
- 3. Communication
- 4. Leadership
- 5. Personal responsibility
- 6. Teamwork
- 7. Creative and critical thinking

You only need to demonstrate three of the seven skills to meet the requirement.

View the <u>co-curricular or service schedule</u> to view all the activities that count towards this requirement or use the calculator below.

Please note, the calculator provides an indicative measure only.

You have met the co-curricular or service requirement when you can demonstrate at least **three of the seven skills.** Use the calculator below to check your current status.

# **Providing supporting documentation**

Documentation for each activity listed in your application must be provided. Supporting evidence can be any document that satisfies all of the following criteria:

- it is provided on letterhead with the contact details of an authorised person (see our declaration template)
- it identifies you (the applicant, by full name) as having participated in the cocurricular or service activity
- it identifies the activity (by name) you were involved in
- it identifies the dates you were engaged in the activity and, where applicable, confirms you have meet the relevant commitment requirements as defined in the co-curricular or service schedule.

View examples of documentation that meet these requirements.

There may be some activities you don't have documentation for. In this case, download the <u>co-curricular or service activity declaration</u> and have the form signed by someone who managed your activity.
